Call for Young People

Are you creative, innovative and want to give something back to the community to improve your community?

Then this is your call! You are worthy. You are invited to submit your solidarity idea which can be implemented in the coming months. Solidarity is to do your best for something or someone else other than yourself and to take care of people and what is around you.

Who can apply?

Groups of a minimum of 5 young people between 18 to 30 years of age or a youth group within a youth organisation.

Deadline: 11th January 2021

Award

- Aġenzija Żgħażaġh will award €300 to the best solidarity idea.
- The young people with the best ideas will be assigned a youth worker to coach them on how to develop further their idea and also benefit from opportunities offered by the European Union Programmes Agency (EUPA) through the European Solidarity Corps Programme.
- The young people with the best ideas will be assigned a youth worker to coach them on how to develop further this idea through the European Solidarity Corps funding.



Assessing Criteria

Ideas will be judged according to the criteria below:

Viability (30%): The idea is viable and can realistically be implemented. It demonstrates consideration of potential obstacles to implementation/adoption and has proposed convincing solutions to address these challenges.

Potential for Impact (30%): The proposed idea addresses the current situation or need within the community and the applicants provide enough argument to make the idea address the circumstance.

Community Familiarity (20%): The applicants demonstrates familiarity with the community they plan to address.

Quality and Creativity (20%): The proposed idea is innovative, the overall merit of this idea is high, and this is an idea worth investing in.

Written Proposal: Required Elements

1. Identification of situation or need

This section includes a clear description and background information on the identified circumstance.

2. Existing Solutions

This section is an overview of any existing interventions that have been implemented so far to address the situation. Where applicable, applicants should discuss the limitations of these approaches, the gaps that still exist, and present research on what has been done in the past and where those solutions fell short.





3. *Proposed Innovation*

This section includes a summary of the innovative idea, how it works, and its intended impact. This is the “nuts and bolts” portion of the proposal and focuses on what the implementation of this idea will look like.

4. *Team Description*

A brief description that explains the capability of the team or organisation to pursue the idea.

Time Line

30th November 2020: Launch of Award

11th January 2021: Deadlines of Applications

15th January 2021: Publishing of Results

Award Ceremony follows in February.
