

Expression of Interest for Photography Expert Practitioners with Aġenzija Żgħażaġħ

1.0 Aġenzija Żgħażaġħ is collaborating with the Directorate for STEM and VET Programmes within the Ministry for Education, Youth, Sports, Research and Innovation to launch the first edition of the Lens of Change supported by Eurodesk, an educational programme in photography with its main focus on active citizenship for young people between 13 and 16 years.

2.0 Lens of Change supported by Eurodesk aims to encourage young photographers to develop their creative and technical skills in photography. It seeks to motivate young people in secondary schools to produce their own photos while providing them with opportunities to receive mentoring and guidance from established Photography Expert Practitioners. 3.0 The programme will be held over four (4) sessions from the 10th August 2026 until the 13th August 2026. The sessions will be held between 08:30 and 13:00 hours. Sessions will introduce young people to the fundamental elements of:

3.1 The power of photography as a tool for storytelling and activism.

3.2 Equip them with basic photography skills and techniques.

3.3 Encourage them to capture meaningful images that reflect social issues or positive change.

4.0 The proposed sessions should cover issues related to creative, technical, interpersonal, analytical and problem-solving skills.

5.0 The chosen expert/s will collaborate with the youth workers at Aġenzija Żgħażaġħ to prepare for the sessions.

6.0 An expression of interest should be submitted to Aġenzija Żgħażaġħ, and must include the following:

6.1 A description of the practitioner's expertise and an outline of the sessions' content and their area of expertise.

6.2 The cost per hour is Euro 21.50 VAT inclusive, covering preparation, delivery and evaluation, but excludes resources which will be provided by Aġenzija Żgħażaġħ and the Directorate for STEM and VET Programmes within the Ministry for Education.

6.3 A Europass CV.

6.4 A Police Conduct (to be presented for verification only during the interview).

7.0 Eligible practitioners include but are not limited to:

7.1 Teaching experience in Media Literacy Education or photography.

7.2 A degree at MQF Level 6 in a subject related to Media or photography.

Applicants will be interviewed. The selection criteria will be based on experience and expertise.
